
## BUILDING THE PERFECT UNION

Building the perfect Union isn't as complicated as you may think. Each stripe on a Union flag is relative to the height of the flag. For example, the central cross is made by dividing the height of the flag by 5. Further details are stated in the chart below.



## **Stripe Width**

| <b>A</b> - 1/5th |
|------------------|
| <b>B</b> - 1/5th |
| <b>C</b> - 1/5th |
| <b>D</b> - 1/5th |
| <b>E -</b> 1/5th |

## **Colour References**

| Colour     | Pantone | С    | М    | Υ   | K   |
|------------|---------|------|------|-----|-----|
| Royal Blue | 280 C   | 100% | 72%  | 0%  | 18% |
| Red        | 186 C   | 0    | 100% | 81% | 4%  |
| White      | -       | 0    | 0%   | 0%  | 0%  |

The diagonal stripes rotate around the flag clockwise, the wider stripe is first, followed by the red stripe, then the narrow white.

To ensure they are aligned correctly, the edge between the red and wide white tripe should align diagonally, see above diagram.
